## THE ANTI-COUNTERFEIT RESOLUTIONS 2018

- HAVING CONVENED at the 1<sup>st</sup> CEO Structured Dialogue on Counterfeits on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> August 2018 to assess the impact of counterfeits and devise meaningful and practical interventions to combat the emerging counterfeiting sub-culture using a combination of strategies built around legislation, regulation, enforcement, technologies and communication;
- THREATENED by the prevalence of counterfeit products and services in Uganda and the
  region and the negative effect that counterfeits have on; Intellectual Property, genuine
  business, Foreign Direct Investment, employment, public health, environment,
  Government revenue, local content development and poverty eradication efforts;
- ENCOURAGED by the intervention strategies submitted by the Government of Uganda through its relevant institutions represented today and appreciating government's commitment to working with key national, regional and global stakeholders to stop counterfeits and illicit trade in Uganda and the region;
- 4. RECOGNIZING that the Anti-Counterfeit Network is a full-time Civil Society Organization committed to bridging the Intervention gaps between the multiple stakeholders/sectors that affect and/or are being affected by counterfeits & that these sectors include Pharmaceuticals, Agriculture, Beverages, Petroleum, Electronics, Education, Government, Cosmetics, Construction, Currencies, Organizations, Media, Motor sectors;
- AFFIRMING our resolve to work together as Civil Society, Regulators, Brand Protection Agencies, Development Partners, Religious, Cultural, Business leaders and consumers to support the implementation of these interventions aimed at combating the counterfeit menace as follows;



- Legislation: Enacting and/or strengthening of Intellectual Property, Anti-Counterfeiting, Standards and other related laws so as to create an effective, robust clear and harmonized legal regime.
- Regulation: Ensuring that Regulatory authorities/bodies account for their statutory mandate and act in concert with each other and other stakeholders to ensure coordinated and systematic implementation of anti counterfeit and/or standards related laws
- Enforcement: Building effective, consistent, and multi-agency investigation, surveillance and enforcement capacity with the understanding that illicit trade is organized and swift crime.
- iv) Technology: Ensuring the development, sourcing and deployment of technology to assist government, business owners and consumers to detect, trace, and monitor counterfeit and illicit goods in order to inform decision making.
- v) Communication: Sensitization and benchmarking of best practice through mass communication campaigns, dialogues, competitions, awards, certification, cluster meetings and trainings of all stakeholders in order to deter consumption of and trade in counterfelts and substandard goods across the supply chain including consumers.
- vi) Intellectual Property Promotion and Protection Fund: Establishing a voluntary financing mechanism to sustain the implementation of the above interventions and promotion of intellectual property generation.
